MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

Mainstage Productions (musicals and plays)

Active Members benefit from the casting policy for these productions: 70% of a show's leading roles are cast from established membership, 30% from new membership.

Non-Mainstage Productions

Smaller shows and cabarets are put on throughout the season on the third floor of the Community House.

Audition Priority

Active members, when they arrive, jump to the front of the line and are seen before non-members.

Members-Only Meet & Greets with Directors and Artistic Staff

These informal gatherings, where members learn about the director's vision for the show and what he/she will be looking for at auditions, are held prior to auditions.

General Meetings & Social Outings

Members socialize and get the inside scoop on the current happenings of the Players. Exclusive E-Newsletters keep Players in touch and informed between General Meetings. Every six to eight weeks we come together for karaoke, to attend shows and movies, meet for Happy Hour at a favorite bar and more.

Annual Parties

Members are invited to annual parties, such as the Intermission Ball (summer) and the Holiday Sing-A-Long (early December)

Sign up for at least one of the following operational committees that support our season: Marketing; Fundraising; Membership (suggest/produce social events and foster new-member recruitment), Staff Selection (interview and hire artistic and technical staff for Mainstage productions); Production (help staff auditions, fill crew positions, help with sets and props, produce, stage manage); Concessions & Box Office; Off Mainstage productions (assist in producing smaller shows and cabarets).
